
Baltimore Ravens vs Indianapolis Colts Betting Odds

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Baltimore Ravens (2-2) vs. Indianapolis Colts (2-2) Betting Odds: Lucas Oil Stadium in Indianapolis will be filled to capacity for this Sunday NFL Week 6 showdown between the Baltimore Ravens (2nd in AFC North) and the Indianapolis Colts (2nd in AFC South). What should be a terrific game can be seen live and in crystal clear HD this Sunday on CBS beginning at 1 PM ET (10 AM PT).

Odds-makers at LooseLines.com have posted the following NFL Online Sports Betting Odds favoring the Indianapolis Colts [-4½] over the visiting Baltimore Ravens [+4½] in Week 6.

The last time these clubs met dates back to last year's NFL Week 14, when Peyton Manning threw for 4 TDs, as the Indianapolis Colts clinched a playoff birth by blowing out Ray Lewis and the Ravens, 44-20.

Nevertheless, this time around might not be so easy for Manning and the Colts. Indianapolis will be going up against the NFL's top-ranked defense, and considering their struggles early on, this one could go either way.

After 5 Weeks in the books, the Ravens defense is the best in the NFL in 3 of the 4 major categories (192.5 yards, 128.5 passing yards, and 64.0 rushing yards), and in the other one, they're ranked 3rd in the league (14.0 points). The OVER/UNDER for this NFL matchup between the Baltimore Ravens vs. Indianapolis Colts is set at a combined total of 39 points scored.

But the Ravens do have an Achilles heel, and that's on the offensive side of the ball. Baltimore is ranked 27th in points scored (18.8), 24th in yards (289.8), and 31st in passing yards (136.0). Nevertheless, it's also worth noting that they possess a very capable running attack, which is currently ranked 4th best in the league with 153.8 yards per. That, in conjunction with the fact that the Colts' "D" can't stop anyone from running all over them (currently ranked dead-last in the NFL with 188.5 rushing yards per), it should be very interesting to see how this one turns out, considering the Colts getting a -4½ point spread to fulfill.
