Oscar De La Hoya (39-5-0, 30 KOs) vs. Manny Pacquiao (47-3-2, 36 KOs) Betting Odds Preview: It turns out that one of the most prominent fighters of our time, Oscar De La Hoya, doesn't plan to retire after the Manny Pacquiao fight after all. According to the Golden Boy himself, he wants to fight at least a few more times after his December 9th, Las Vegas mega-bout against the hard-hitting Filipino.

Expert fighting Odds-makers at BodogLife.com have posted the following Online Sports Betting Odds in favor of the "Golden Boy"; Oscar De La Hoya [-230] defeating a very tough opponent in Manny Pacquiao [+180].

The 35-year-old Olympic Gold Medalist and East-LA hero talked about his state of mind going forward after this fight:

"There's no doubt about it. My mind can still do it, my body can still do it, I'm going to ride the wave for a little while," De La Hoya said.

Last year, Oscar broke box office and pay-per-view records with his fight against Floyd Mayweather Jr.

I would have come back. There's no doubt about it," De La Hoya said. "I'm definitely going to fight after this." The OVER/UNDER for this, the biggest fight of the year between Oscar De La Hoya vs. Manny Pacquiao on Dec. 9 has been set at a total of 9.5 rounds.
