Virginia Tech vs Boston College College Football Odds: The Hokies are (5-1) on a 5 game winning streak coming into this game. Last week they got a win over Western Kentucky 27-13 as 26 point favorites. QB Taylor finished with 125 yards passing for the Hokies, before being replaced by former starter Sean Glennon with 8:58 left in the third quarter. No one doubts that VT has shown heart and determination, but that can only bail out what's proven to be a very weak offense so many times. The sports odds posted by the oddsmakers at Sbgglobal.com currently list Boston College -2.5 favorites to Virginia Tech heading into this matchup.

The Eagles (4-1) are on a 3 game winning streak with their last win coming two weeks ago against NC State on the road 38-31.

QB Chris Crane was 34/51 for 428 yards, 2 TD's and 1INT. Crane was coming off an up-and-down stretch in his efforts to replace Matt Ryan, the NFL first-round draft pick who helped the Eagles reach No. 2 in the rankings last year. Boston College has faced a very weak schedule to open 2008. The Eagles are 4-1 straight up and 3-1 against the spread, but those four wins have come against teams with a combined 7-19 record.
