Seattle Seahawks vs Tampa Bay Buccaneers Sunday Night Football: The Seahawks are (1-4) coming off a home loss to Green Bay 27-17. The stunned Seahawks paid for having to start No. 3 quarterback Charlie Frye, because Matt Hasselbeck was inactive - he will be getting his bruised knee reevaluated on Monday - and backup Seneca Wallace was out with a calf injury. It's an open question as to whether Matt Hasselbeck or Charlie Frye will run the Seahawks this week, but it's doubtful that will matter considering the way the Tampa-2 has defended the West Coast offense. The sports odds posted by the oddsmakers at Bookmaker.com currently list Tampa Bay Buccaneers -10.5 favorites to Seattle Seahawks heading into this matchup. "It's a challenge. The young men who have to play the game are doing everything they can," Seahawks' coach Mike Holmgren said. "But you know, Matt is a coach on the field. He's been here a long time. You have a franchise quarterback and you lose him, it changes."

The Buccaneers are (4-2) off a big home win over Carolina 27-3 last week. Garcia, starting for the first time since the opener because Brian Griese is injured, threw for 173 yards and a touchdown. Warrick Dunn had his most productive day running the ball since rejoining the Bucs with 115 yards on 22 carries. Jeff Garcia's return to the Tampa line-up helped them thrash the Panthers, but is the real secret weapon Warrick Dunn? Now tied for first in the NFC South, Tampa Bay needs to take care of business against Seattle to keep pace in the division. This is a great situation for a TB team that will seize the chance to get even here and stay atop the surprising NFC South.
